Community Based Voluntary Services (CB-VS)

What does the CBVS Program do?

The CBVS program was created to intervene before the state or DCYF has to take serious measures. Our goal is to help you and your family when you need help the most so DCYF does not have to. This is a preventive program, which means we try to prevent the most drastic measures from being taken by the state. We want to avoid situations, not wait for things to get worse.

What do you do that the State can't?

We are NOT DCYF! We want families to understand that we do not work for the state and we have your best interest at heart. If we know the extent of a situation a family is in, we can give them the best help possible. We have open communication with DCYF so we are able to learn as much as we can about the family.

What is Solution-Based Casework?

Each family is different. And different families come with different obstacles. We tackle those obstacles in a unique way based on what works best for the family. By practicing Solution-Base Casework, we are able to support each family with resources and solutions that fit their needs. Truly a case-by-case basis!

How do you get into this program?

CBVS is a program that is referred to families or parents from the state. DCYF deals with a lot and doesn't always have the capabilities to help individual families. **That's where we come in**.

What Does The Process Look Like?

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No! The last thing we want is for a family to end up where they started. When the 6 months are up, we still have resources that can be utilized by the families. Our goal is to get a family back on their feet and stay on their feet. We do that by either recommending another program we provide or recommend something outside our facilities. We will not leave a family to fend for themselves. (Of course, these services are voluntary, so a family can opt out of them at any point, however we believe it takes a village so if a family wants the support, it's there!)

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
